THE WESTFIELD PANTRY



The Westfield Pantry was set up to help families within our school. Thanks to a £500 grant from Sainsburys and a donation from the store at Rawdon our pantry has been re-stocked.

The Pantry is available to anyone who may be struggling to buy food, whether it be just a couple of days worth of meals or a larger food parcel. If you are requesting a food parcel we ask for a donation of 10% of the value of the parcel which we will use to replenish stock. Donations to the Westfield Pantry can be made throughout the year, either in cash, on School Spider or by bringing items to the office. SCHOOL SPIDER AND TAPESTRY LOGINS FOR NURSERY AND RECEPTION

If your child has started in Nursery or Reception you should have now received your login for School Spider and Tapestry Learning Journal. If you haven't please contact the school office on 0113 2505449 or email admin@westfieldinfants.co.uk.

Tapestry is a tool that we use in Nursery and Reception **only** to share your child's learning in the setting. This year in Nursery the aim is to share at least one photo per week. Parents can also share special occasions at home. In Reception we have a slightly different approach to Nursery. There will be group photos of specific activities uploaded. One week per half term there will be an increase in the number of photos and observations when your child is one of the children of the week. You are also welcome to upload photos of special occasions at home.

ATTENDANCE

At Yeadon Westfield Infant School we value great attendance and work in close partnership with parents and carers to ensure every child is accessing their education. As with every school, and in line with DFE guidance, we make a distinction between 'authorised absence' and 'unauthorised absence'. Below are some examples of both, but please be aware this list is not exhaustive:

Authorised Absence	Unauthorised absence
Medical appointment (with letter)	Unexplained absences
• Illness	Family holiday in term time
Family bereavement	 Truancy
Religious observance (2 days max)	Birthdays

Our responses to non-attendance are evidence based and intended to be implemented at the point of most impact. Below are the key stages for parents and carers to be aware of:

- **97% +** Attendance is positive and a cause of celebration
- **93% -97%** Attendance is reasonable but could be improved. School will monitor.
- **90% 93%** Attendance is becoming a concern. From October half term, a letter outlining the risk of persistent absence will be issued other than in exceptional circumstances when attendance is at 93% or lower.
- <90% From September, absence will no longer be authorised without a medical note

PUNCTUALITY

Although we appreciate that there are occasionally circumstances which prevent a prompt arrival and that your child may have been late by just a few minutes, late arrivals can make it more difficult for your child to settle into the school day and cause disruption for the class in general. Please help us to help your child gain the most from their time in school by ensuring that they arrive on time. The school day starts at 8.40am when the doors open. We close the gate and doors at 8.50am sharp. The expectation is that children are in the playground ready to enter the classroom at 8.40am. If your child arrives after 8.50am you will need to take them to the office to be signed in. Well done to everyone arriving on time for our new start time.

PSA UPDATE

At the end of last term a number of parents expressed interest in restarting the PSA to raise funds for school. Sharon Telford whose granddaughter is in Year 1 took the lead and sent out this message to parents:-

'Remember lock down and home schooling and how difficult it all was ... think about how much all our children benefit from our fantastic school right on our doorstep. PARKING

We have had a number of complaints already from local residents about parking near school.

Please remember the following points:-

- Please drive slowly, safely and with consideration to pedestrians and other drivers.
- Please **do not** park with your wheels on the pavement, forcing pedestrians into the road.
- The 'No Parking' areas around school are clearly marked. Please be aware that our community police issue tickets during spot-checks in the area.
- Please do not block local residents' driveways, preventing residents getting cars in and out
 of their own homes.
- Please **do not** block the entrance to the school gates. There needs to be access at all times for emergency vehicles.
- Please do not park on the dropped kerb where children are crossing the road to school.
- Please do not leave your engine running while your vehicle is parked
