Ospreys don't live in our country all the time. They arrive here in March or April and leave again at the end of the summer. So where do they go?

Most of our ospreys spend the winter in West

Africa in Senegal or Gambia. They make a journey of
thousands of miles to the United Kingdom or other
parts of Europe. Our ospreys will have travelled along
the West African coast, or maybe even over the Sahara
desert, then up through Spain and France and over the
English Channel into England.
