

Read 'Story green words'	Counting - have fun with any of our YouTube counting songs, but make sure you can count fluently in 1s, 2s, 5s, 10s and 100s without the support of a song!  Learn its - keep practising your number facts (attached). You need to know these off by heart to help you with calculations in Year 2! Keep practising writing out your fact families!  Calculations:  Take these numbers: 2, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 10. Write them in the middle of a piece of paper.  Now, how many calculations can you write around them?  See the photo below!	Draw and label your dream bike. Think about: the size of the bike, the style of the bike, what colours you would use and the sort of wheels you would have. 


