What would you do?</p>	<p>Addition:</p> <p>Use jungle animal toys or pictures of different jungle animals and use the number of legs to create additions. E.g. a lion has 4 legs and a parrot has 2 legs. $4+2=6$</p> <p>Make the additions as challenging as you can!</p>	<p>YouTube: 'Cosmic kids yoga jungle safari'</p> <p>There are a few more jungle themed yoga sessions too. Check them out!</p>
Thursday		<p>Listen to the YouTube story or read the book if you have it at home.</p> <p>Write: Read a jungle themed story or listen to one on youtube. Write a book review. Did you enjoy the story? Why?</p> 	<p>Data handling:</p> <p>Gazelles are really good at jumping. How far can the people in your home jump? Record the data collected and record in a simple graph.</p> 	<p>Art: create a jungle scene</p> <p>Using any art and craft materials: paint, felt tips, crayons, crepe paper etc. Make your picture 3D by adding kitchen tubes for trees. Create different shades of green by using black, white and green paint.</p> <p>Look at the artist Henri Rousseau and his paintings as inspiration for painting your own picture.</p>
Friday		<p>Listen to the YouTube story or read the book if you have it at home.</p> <p>Write: What can you see in the jungle? Look at a picture and describe the things/animals you can see. Google some pictures or visit Twinkl: 'jungle writing stimulus picture'</p> 	<p>Youtube: listen to some of our favourite counting songs!</p> <p>Type in:</p> <p>'counting to 20 songs', 'counting to 100 songs'</p> <p>'Counting in 2s', 'Counting in 5s', 'counting in 10s' (scratch garden)</p> <p>'2D shape songs', '3D shape songs'</p> <p>'Numberjacks' and 'Numberblocks' have nice 5/ 10 minute episodes relating to number and shape.</p> <p>'Jack Hartmann' has a song for EVERYTHING. Check out his channel too.</p>	<p>PE/Dance</p> <p>Create a dance to rainforest music- visit YouTube and explore a wide variety of music.</p> <p>Call out different jungle animals and move in the character of the animal. Use large and oversized movements and don't forget to make sound effects!</p>
