Spellings/ Tricky word ideas

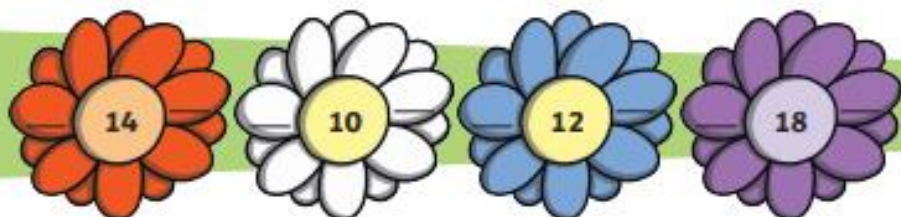
Make sure you can spell: *saw, more, less, your, door, floor*

4	Write each word in order of length
5	Put the words in alphabetical order
6	Rainbow words - Write each word with a coloured crayon. Trace over each word using a different colour.
7	Ladder words - Example 'exit' e ex exi exit
8	Write each word in cursive script and make sure they sit on the line
9	Put each word into a meaningful sentence
