






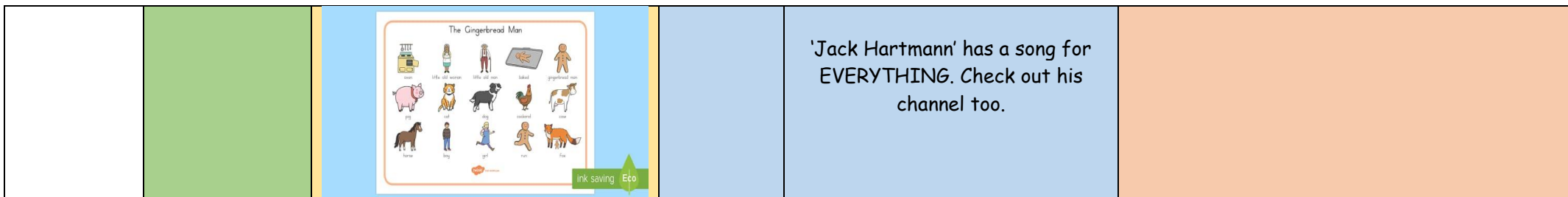

Monday	Phase 4 Looking at CVCC words	<p>Listen to the story or read the book if you have it at home.</p> <p>Story: Twinkl> The Gingerbread Man Narrated Story. Mute the volume and read along together if you prefer.</p> <p>YouTube have various story versions to check out too.</p>	Division/ Sharing step 1	<p>Sharing fairly</p> <p>Have a tea party for some toys. Set out 2, 3 or 4 plates for the toys. Ask your child to share out a certain number of cereal pieces, raisins etc fairly. Make sure they count out the correct amount and then share out one at a time.</p> 	<p>Making your own Gingerbread Man</p> <p>Your challenge today is to make your very own Gingerbread Man. You can make it out of playdough (if you don't have playdough there is a simple recipe for it on the next page) or you can bake your own Gingerbread Man (recipe attached to memo) OR you can do both! If you don't have access to a printer then copy out the words from the sheet in a mixed up order. Children to cut out the words and put in the right order. Gingerbread Play Dough Recipe:

1 cup salt

2 cups water

4 Tbsp. oil

2 Tbsp. cream of tartar

1 Tbsp. ground ginger

2 Tbsp. cinnamon

2 cups flour

- Mix the first 6 ingredients (everything except for the flour!) into a sauce pan.
- Cook on the stove over medium heat, stirring well.
- Then, add the 2 cups of flour.
- Reduce heat and stir vigorously until the dough forms a ball.
- Remove from heat.
- Let the dough cool and knead well.
- Store in an airtight container. It will last for months!

Troubleshooting:

If your dough is too sticky, either cook a little bit longer until it gets hard in the pan and forms a solid ball of dough. OR, add a bit more flour as you knead the finished dough.
